Explanatory note

Section 6 of the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989* provides for holders of certain offices (“recognised office holders”) specified in Schedule 1 to the Act to receive an additional salary and expense allowance as well as the basic salary to which they are entitled as Members of Parliament. The additional salary and expense allowance to be received is expressed as a percentage of the basic salary.

The object of this Regulation is to increase the remuneration of the Deputy Opposition Whip in the Legislative Council.

This Regulation is made under the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989*, including sections 6 and 21 (the general regulation making power).
