## Ministers' Salaries.

## Act No. 2, 1908.

MINISTERS SALARIES.

An Act to appropriate out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund an annual amount for the salaries of the Ministers of the Crown; toamend the Constitution Act, 1902; and for other purposes. [13th January, 1908.]

B<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Commencement and short title.

1. This act shall commence on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and may be cited as the "Ministers' Salaries Act, 1907."

Amendment of s. 41 of Gonstitution Act.

2. (1) Subsection one of section forty-one of the Constitution Act, 1902, is amended by omitting the word "twenty-five" and inserting in place thereof the word "twenty."

Amendment of Third Schedule.

(2) The Third Schedule to the said Act is amended by omitting the following words and figures:—

3. There is hereby specially appropriated out of the Consolidated salaries of Ministers. Revenue Fund an annual amount for the salaries from the commencement of this Act of the Ministers of the Crown, being Members of the Executive Council, as hereinafter mentioned, at the rate of eleven thousand and forty pounds per annum:---

Amendment of Second Schedule of Constitution Act,

4. The Second Schedule of the Constitution Act, 1902, is amended by omitting the word "Postmaster-General" and inserting instead thereof the words "Minister for Agriculture."
