

SYDNEY CORPORATION  
(AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 6, 1933.

**An** Act to provide for the postponement of the triennial elections of aldermen directed by the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932, to be held in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three; to extend the term of office of the aldermen of the City of Sydney at present holding office; to amend the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932; and for purposes connected therewith. **B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1933." Short title.

(2) This Act shall be read and construed with the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932.

**2.** (1) (a) The triennial election of aldermen directed by section nineteen of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932, to be held on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, is hereby postponed until a day (in this Act referred to as "the appointed day") to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette. Postponement of election of aldermen.

The day so appointed shall not be later than the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

(b) The aldermen in office at the commencement of this Act may, subject to the provisions of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932, as amended by subsection one of this section, remain in office until the election of aldermen on the appointed day is held, and shall then retire from office, but may at such election be re-elected if otherwise qualified.

(2) Nothing in this section shall affect the operation of section twenty of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932.
