Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to declare Crown cemetery trusts as bodies that are public authorities for the purposes of the *Independent Commission Against Corruption Act 1988*.

This Regulation is made under the *Independent Commission Against Corruption Act 1988*, including paragraph (g) of the definition of **public authority** in section 3 (1) and section 117 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Independent Commission Against Corruption Amendment (Public Authority) Regulation 2014*.

2 Commencement

3 Amendment of Independent Commission Against Corruption Regulation 2010

Clause 18

Omit the clause. Insert instead:

18 Definition of “public authority”

For the purposes of paragraph (g) of the definition of *public authority* in section 3(1) of the Act the following are declared to be a body within that definition:

- (a) each affiliated health organisation and statutory health corporation,
- (b) each reserve trust established under the *Crown Lands Act 1989* in relation to a reserve or part of a reserve that is dedicated or reserved for the purposes of a public cemetery or crematorium or a related purpose.
