Explanatory note

The objects of this Regulation are:

- (a) to declare the Blacktown International Sportspark to be a major event venue in respect of the International Cricket Council Cricket World Cup 2015, and
- (b) to make provision with respect to the application of Part 4 of the *Major Events Act 2009* in relation to the International Cricket Council Cricket World Cup 2015 at that venue.

This Regulation is made under the *Major Events Act 2009*, including sections 5 and 72 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Major Events Amendment (Safety and Crowd Management) Regulation 2015*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Major Events Regulation 2010

[1] Clause 17 Definitions

Insert in alphabetical order in clause 17 (1):

Blacktown International Sportspark means the sports park at Rooty Hill bounded by Knox Road, Eastern Road, the M7 Motorway and the Western railway line.

[2] Clause 18 Declaration of Cricket World Cup as major event

Insert “Blacktown International Sportspark,” after “Sydney Cricket Ground,” in clause 18 (2).

[3] Clause 19 Major event venues or facilities

Insert after clause 19 (f):

(g) Blacktown International Sportspark.

[4] Application of provisions of Part 4 of Act

Insert after clause 21 (2):

- (3) Despite subclauses (1) and (2), for the purposes of section 5 (4) (c) of the Act the provisions of Division 5 of Part 4 of the Act are the only provisions of Part 4 of the Act that apply in relation to Blacktown International Sportspark and those provisions apply only on 9, 10 and 12 February 2015.
