

LIQUOR (ANZAC DAY) AMEND- MENT ACT.

An Act to provide for the closing of hotels for the sale of liquor on the morning of Anzac Day; to amend section fifty-seven of the Liquor Act, 1912, and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 26th February, 1935.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Liquor (Anzac Day) Amendment Act, 1935."

2. The Liquor Act, 1912, is amended by inserting in subsection one of section fifty-seven after the words "Christmas Day" the words "or upon the morning of the day upon which Anzac Day is observed in each year."
