Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Liquor Regulation 2008* to extend by 12 months the freeze period for restrictions on the granting of liquor licences, various other liquor-related applications and development consents in respect of premises in freeze precincts specified in Schedule 5 to the *Liquor Act 2007*.

This Regulation is made under the *Liquor Act 2007*, including paragraph (b) of the definition of *freeze period* in section 47A (1) and section 159 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

Insert after clause 78:

79 Extension of temporary freeze on licences and other authorisations

For the purposes of the definition of *freeze period* in section 47A (1) of the Act, 24 June 2012 is prescribed as the day on which the freeze period ends.
