Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Conveyancing (Sale of Land) Regulation 2017* to provide that a set aside relating to the clearing of native vegetation under Part 5A of the *Local Land Services Act 2013* and a remediation order under Part 11 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* are adverse affectations of land for the purposes of a contract for the sale of land.

This Regulation is made under the *Conveyancing Act 1919*, including section 52A.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Conveyancing (Sale of Land) Amendment (Native Vegetation) Regulation 2017*.

Schedule 3 Prescribed warranties

Insert at the end of the Schedule:

- 29** A mandatory code compliant certificate under Part 5A of the *Local Land Services Act 2013* that requires the establishment of a set aside area.
- 30** A remediation order under Part 11 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016*.
